



GETTING STARTED

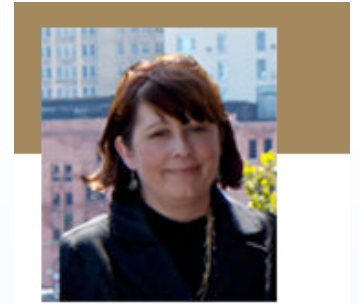
From our [Sign Up](#) page, just provide us with your full name, email address, desired password, gender, and date of birth.

If you are a current high school student, you will have the option to join one of our supported high school networks. If you are no longer in high school, you can join one of our college or workplace networks.

After you complete the sign up form, we will send an email to the address you provided. Clicking on the confirmation link will complete the sign up process.



- How old do you have to be? In order to be eligible to sign up for Facebook, users must be thirteen (13) years of age or older.
- Can you have multiple accounts on Facebook? No, you can only have one profile account on facebook. If you set up more than one, you risk getting your account shut down.
- Why do you need my birthdate: This is used to verify your account. Don't worry, you do not have to display this on your profile.

Having a profile picture makes it easier for friends to identify you as being the real you, especially if you have a common name.

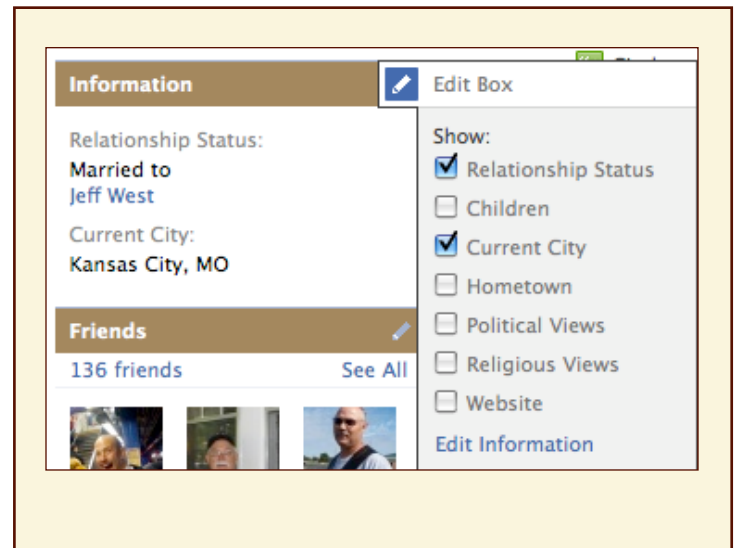
In addition, the picture you select is another way to express who you are to your friends and family.

Facebook helps you share information with your friends and the people you care about.

Facebook provides granular privacy settings intended to help you control your information so you can choose who can see what. You can decide to share certain information (such as your photos and work history) with everyone and other more sensitive information (such as your phone number) with just your friends.

Privacy Settings

Privacy on Facebook

Privacy is built around a few key ideas: You should have control over what you share. It should be easy to find and connect with friends. Your privacy settings should be simple and easy to understand.

On Facebook, there are three basic levels of privacy:

Friends, Friends of Friends, Everyone.

You also have a set of public information, which helps your friends find and connect with you: your Name, Profile Picture, Gender, and any Connections you've made. This includes the friends, networks and Pages you've chosen to connect to. You also always have control over who can see your Connections on your profile.

If you are ever curious about how your friends see your profile, or what information Everyone can see, use this tool to see how people see you.

Recommended settings

We offer recommendations for your privacy settings based on the three levels of privacy: Friends, Friends of Friends, and Everyone.

We recommend **Everyone** be able to see information that will make it easier for friends to find, identify and learn about you. This includes basic information like your About Me description and your Website, as well as the default setting for posts that you create, like photo albums and status updates.

Remember, any information that's visible to Everyone may be seen by everyone on the internet. It will be visible to anyone viewing your profile, and Facebook Platform applications and websites that you use will be able to access it. Additionally, it may be visible in search engines .

USING SOCIAL PLUG-INS

Can websites that use social plugins publish information about me?

No information is published if you do not interact with social plugins. If you click "Like" or make a comment using a social plugin, your activity will be published on Facebook and shown to your Facebook friends who see an Activity Feed or Recommendations plugin on the same site. The things you like will be displayed publicly on your profile.

What am I sharing when I click a "Like" or "Recommend" button on external websites?

The "Like" and "Recommend" buttons on other sites work in a similar way to the "Share" buttons from Facebook and other services that you've likely seen on the web for years. These buttons enable you to publicly express your interest in some piece of content with a simple action, similar to how you might rate a restaurant or movie on a site today. Nothing happens unless you choose to click the buttons, and you must be logged into Facebook before you can use them.

When you click "Like" or "Recommend," the button turns darker to indicate that you like or recommend something and are making a public connection to it. Back on Facebook, a story will appear on your profile and may appear in your friends' News Feeds, just as if you had liked something on Facebook. You can click "Like" again if you wish to remove the like.

Your likes and recommendations also may appear to your friends on the website where you clicked the button and elsewhere through other Facebook social plugins appearing on websites (e.g., Activity Feed or Recommendations). Some sites may also give you the option to add a comment when you like or recommend something.

In some cases, when you create a connection to a real world entity, such as a book, movie or athlete, your likes and recommendations become a part of your profile in the same way as the connections you make with Pages on Facebook. They will appear in your "Likes and Interests" section of your profile, and you may receive updates from that connection in News Feed.
